



Why Ocean and Shark Conservation?

This is a note from Peter Verhoog and Georgina Wiersma, the CEOs of the Save Our Seas Foundation (SOSF), Peter and Georgina are underwater photographers, writers, publishers and passionate advocates for ocean conservation and education.

Our oceans are home to many creatures of unbelievable diversity and color. They cover about two-thirds of the Earth's surface and help create the atmosphere in which plants, humans and animals can live. They form the life-support system for our planet, consuming carbon dioxide and producing between one-third and one-half of the world's oxygen.



These great masses of water also impact our weather and climate. And as home to many thousands of species of fishes and invertebrates, oceans provide an important part of the global food chain. Both marine mammals and humans depend heavily on healthy oceans for food. Unless the oceans remain healthy, whales, dolphins, other marine mammals - and even people - will not survive.

The oceans also provide social and economic goods and services, are used for tourism and recreation, marine transport and coastal protection.

In salty ocean waters, the most common large predators are sharks. In spite of their immense power and fully perfected streamline that even evolution itself has left untouched for millions of years, they are not only extremely vulnerable, but also despised and slaughtered. Sharks have long been hunted by fishers, who know how much the economic value of these animals has increased over the past twenty years. Their fins are a delicacy for the Asian markets, and many millions of sharks die a miserable death as by-catch on fishing lines and in nets. The main focus of the Save Our Seas Foundation is sharks. Sharks play a key role in the oceans, like lions do on land. They keep the oceans fish and mammal populations healthy. If the sharks would disappear, the ecological balance in our oceans would be lost.

We hope that this book will evoke the same emotions in its readers as we have felt in our diving experiences: admiration, respect and awe. And the sincere will to save the oceans' creatures from extinction, so that every child in this world can see their beauty.
